4-H CARTEENS Returns to Jackson County!



4-H CARTEENS is a traffic safety program conducted by 4-H teen leaders and their program partners for first-time juvenile traffic offenders. 4-H CARTEENS goals include:

- reducing the number of repeat juvenile traffic offenders,
- decreasing the number of teen traffic offenders, and
- increasing teen awareness of traffic/vehicular safety.

The Jackson County Juvenile Courts system created a partnership with Jackson County OSU Extension, 4-H Youth Development, to re-implement the traffic safety program for teens starting January 3rd, 2023.

Jackson County 4-H CARTEENS aims to keep teen drivers safe but have fun while doing it. Youth, and their parent or guardian, will participate in numerous engaging activities to get them thinking about safety on the road. CARTEENS sessions include a variety of guest presenters, engaging activities, and serious discussion about driving safely.

4-H Advisor and Parent Updates:

It is that time of year again when we start recruiting new 4-H volunteers! A 4-H Volunteer is any adult who helps with the 4-H program in any way on a regular basis. These may be “parents”, “helpers”, “committee members”, or “advisors”. However, whatever you call them, they must be an approved Ohio 4-H Volunteer, have an application on file in the Extension office, and have passed an Ohio BCI fingerprint background check.

Anyone interested in becoming a 4-H Advisor or volunteer must fill out an application and be approved as an Ohio 4-H Volunteer before they can begin working with a club or committee.



4-H Enrollment time is coming up soon! Starting November 1st, members and advisors can begin enrolling!

Interviews for new volunteers will be scheduled following reference checks, at which time applicants will be given information on how to complete the background checks. Orientation meetings will be held after the first of the year.

All new volunteer applications are due by January 31, 2023.

- Full participation in the weekend workshop is required. A minimum of 15 training hours.
- Participants must complete the online National 4-H Shooting Sports e-Learning Modules, prior to attending the workshop. *These modules only need to be completed one time.*
- Registration Deadlines are final.
- Minimum numbers are required for each discipline to be offered.

- Payment is due at the time of registration
- Space is limited in disciplines - Your space is NOT confirmed until payment is received.
- Cancellations made prior to the deadline date will receive a refund minus a processing charge of \$5.00.
- Cancellations made on or after the deadline will not receive a refund. However, workshop fees may be transferred to another approved 4-H volunteer in the same discipline with advanced notice, for the same workshop.
- Registration Fees will NOT be carried forward to the next workshop.

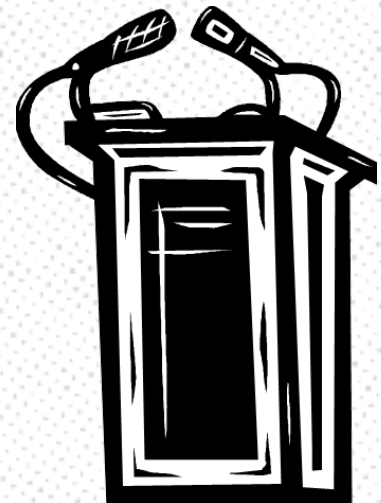

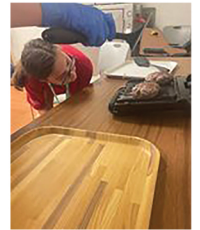
