Jackson County 4-H CARTEENS Kicks Off 2023

On Tuesday, January 3rd, Jackson County 4-H kicked off 2023 with the year's first 4-H CARTEENS class. 20 teen drivers and their parents gathered at the Jackson County OSU Extension Office to learn about staying safe behind the wheel.

4-H CARTEENS is a traffic safety program for first-time juvenile traffic offenders in partnership with the Juvenile Court system and OSU Extension, 4-H Youth Development. CARTEENS teaches youth about the dangers of distracted driving, driving under the influence, speeding, and more. Jackson County 4-H is excited to bring this program back to Jackson County youth after several decades without the teen driving safety program.

Jackson County 4-H would like to thank the Jackson Post of the Ohio State Highway Patrol for providing important information about their jobs and the importance of being safe on the road. 4-H CARTEENS would also like to thank Josh Winters, Jackson County OSU Extension Educator for Agriculture & Natural Resources, for speaking with the teens about stopping distance and driving cautiously around agricultural equipment on our roadways.

Here are some tips to get you enrolled for 2023!

4-H Enrollment has started! Starting **November 1**st, members and volunteers can begin enrolling in 4HOnline! But don't forget, the 4-H Enrollment Deadline is **April 15**th!

Are you a 4-H member or volunteer having trouble enrolling in 4-H? Never fear, Maddie has created a resource website just for you!

Go to go.osu.edu/JacksonHelp for stepby-step instructions on how to enroll in 4-H Online (and FairEntry).

Do you have new members in your club or family, and are having trouble getting them enrolled? These resources are for NEW and RETURNING volunteers and members!

EVERYONE needs to be enrolled in 4-H Online to receive important communications, enroll in 4-H projects, and more. It is absolutely necessary to be enrolled in the online system. If you are not in the online system, you are not a Jackson County 4-H member or volunteer! Go to https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in to enroll.

Tips for Enrolling in 4-H Online:

- Forgot the password to your family's 4-H Online account? DO NOT CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT. Call our office and we will reset your password for you!
- DO NOT make a new account for each child/adult volunteer. Instead, create ONE family profile and add each person enrolled in 4-H to your family.

Reminder: ALL 4-H members AND volunteers MUST be enrolled in 4-H Online!

4-H Advisor and Parent Updates:

It is that time of year again when we start recruiting new 4-H volunteers! A 4-H Volunteer is any adult who helps with the 4-H program in any way on a regular basis. These may be "parents", "helpers", "committee members", or "advisors". However, whatever you call them, they must be an approved Ohio 4-H Volunteer, have an application on file in the Extension office, and have passed an Ohio BCI fingerprint background check.

Anyone interested in becoming a 4-H Advisor or volunteer must fill out an application and be approved as an Ohio 4-H Volunteer before they can begin working with a club or committee.



4-H Enrollment time is coming up soon! Starting **November 1**st, members and advisors can begin enrolling through **April 15**th!

Interviews for new volunteers will be scheduled following reference checks, at which time applicants will be given information on how to complete the background checks. Orientation meetings will be held after the first of the year.

All <u>new</u> volunteer applications are due by January 31, 2023.

Other County Quality Assurance Dates:

Quality assurance is a pledge or promise to 1) provide a food animal product preferred by consumers, and 2) provide a safe, wholesome food animal product. Food animals are those whose products (i.e., meat and milk) have the potential to become part of the food chain. The program teaches 4-H youth how to use best practices that support the production of quality and safe animal products for consumers, as well as responsible animal handling, care and welfare in not only farm animal production, but also with companion and performance animals. **Quality** assurance is REQUIRED for all market exhibitors at the Jackson County Fair.

Youth exhibitors may attend any Quality Assurance program in the state, so long as they complete their training requirements by the June 1st deadline (45 days before the Jackson County Fair).

Please see the list of County QA dates being offered by surrounding counties.

- ☐ Market Ducks now able to be exhibited at the Jackson County Junior Fair! Market Ducks will be shown on Monday, July 17th, 2023, alongside Chickens and Turkeys. Market Ducks MUST be ordered through the Jackson County Extension Office by April 15th. - ☐ Drug Use Notification Forms (DUNFs) are required for all Market Rabbits. Market Rabbits are intended for consumption and therefore should be drug free.
- ☐ New weight range rules have been established for Dairy Feeders and Beef Feeders. Dairy Feeders and Beef Feeders should weigh between 400-700lbs.
- □ New schedule change for this year's Jackson County Fair 2023: The Rabbit Show will be moved to Thursday, July 20th, 2023, and the Chicken Show will be moved to Monday, July 17th, 2023, so that all poultry can be shown on one day (chickens, turkeys, and ducks).
- ☐ Exhibitors have the option to participate in Skillathon this year! The Skillathon competition will take place Wednesday, June 7th, 2023 12:00pm to 4:00pm at the Jackson County Extension Office. More details to come!


