Ohio 4-H Special Needs Camp


Camper Information:



Ohio 4-H Special Needs Camp is held at Canter's Cave 4-H Camp with support of a 4-H Foundation grant. The facility is in Jackson County, Ohio, just south of Chillicothe. Each summer, we offer a camping experience for youth aged 8-adult who have unique needs that cannot be accommodated in a traditional camp setting. We typically have a small group of between 15-25 campers and their caregivers who spend the weekend doing all the normal camp things, modified for their needs.

This year, Camp will be June 9-11, 2023. Registrations are due June 1.

Counselors come to Camp on Thursday, June 8th, to get onsite training hours and help transform Camp for our Campers. Since caregivers are

onsite for this Camp, Counselors are in a more supportive role and not the primary caregiver. This is a great opportunity to see things from a different perspective and interact with individuals and families in new ways at Camp!

Skillathon FAQs

What is Skillathon?

• Skillathon is a fun test of your knowledge using interactive stations but is not a written test like you would take in school. Stations are more intentional, and youth are encouraged to describe and demonstrate what they have learned.

Do I need to bring my project book?

 Nope! Project books are not checked at Skillathon anymore. Instead, project books will begin being checked at the <u>2024</u> Livestock Project Book Interviews.

Do I need to bring my animals?

• Nope! All animals can stay home.

Why should I participate?

Failure to complete these requirements will deem that exhibitor ineligible to show at the Jackson County Junior Fair and Ohio State Fair.



- ☐ Market Heifers now able to be exhibited at the Jackson County Junior Fair! Market Heifers will follow the same rules as steers and will be shown alongside the Market Steers in an overall Market Beef competition.
- □ New & Revised Jackson County Junior Fair Market Steer Carcass Class Rules can be found at go.osu.edu/JacksonFairForms. If you are interested in taking a Carcass Steer to the 2023 Fair, please sign and return the contract to Cattle Weigh-In on Jan. 7th.
- ☐ Market Ducks now able to be exhibited at the Jackson County Junior Fair! Market Ducks will be shown on Monday, July 17th, 2023, alongside Chickens and Turkeys. Market Ducks MUST be ordered through the Jackson County Extension Office by April 15th. A guidebook for the Market Duck project can be found at https://jackson.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/jackson-county-fair-info/livestock-guidebooks
- ☐ Drug Use Notification Forms (DUNFs) are required for all Market Rabbits. Market Rabbits are intended for consumption and therefore should be drug free.
- ☐ New weight range rules have been established for Dairy Feeders and Beef Feeders. Dairy Feeders and Beef Feeders should weigh between 400-700lbs.
- □ New schedule change for this year's Jackson County Fair 2023: The Rabbit Show will be moved to Thursday, July 20th, 2023, and the Chicken Show will be moved to Monday, July 17th, 2023, so that all poultry can be shown on one day (chickens, turkeys, and ducks).
- Exhibitors have the option to participate in Skillathon this year! The Skillathon competition will take place Wednesday, June 7th, 2023 12:00pm to 4:00pm at the Jackson County Extension Office. More details to come!


